
Worsening per capita water availability


















Number of natural catastrophes worldwide 1980-2010, Munich Re (2011)9




WEF GLOBAL RISKS LANDSCAPE 2013






The superrich have grabbed the bulk of the past three decades' gains.





History of the UK movement - grassroots

1844	Rochdale pioneers
1900s	Co-operative movement expands around the world
1950s	 'Social firms' or sheltered workspaces established to provide employment for disabled soldiers
1950s	Fair trade movement begins
1970s	Different business models begin to use business for social good.
1980s	• Term social entrepreneur begins to be widely used
1990s	Ashoka, SSE, Development Trusts, Leisure Trusts
1998	Social Enterprise London established
2000s	• Public services open up to charities - commercialisation of much of charitable sector
2002	First fair trade international mark
2002	Social Enterprise UK
2008	 Global banking crisis – people increasingly recognising the need for value based capitalism










Developing countries





History of the UK movement – UK government

1997	Prime Minister Tony Blair commits to supporting social entrepreneurs in his first policy speech
2000	• UNLTD* launched to promote and develop social entrepreneurs with £100m endowment
2001	Social Enterprise Unit formed as part of the Department for Trade and Industry
2002	Social Enterprise Coalition (now Social Enterprise UK) established
2005	• Community Interest Companies (CICs) - legislation to create a new form of corporate entity introduced
2009	 Social Enterprise Investment Fund - £100 million fund established for investment in new and existing social enterprises delivering health and social care services

History of the UK movement – public policy

2013

• European Commission establishes **Social Business Initiative** across 3 DG's - a top EC priority to 2022

2014

• **EU procurement directives amended** - thresholds increased, health, social care markets can in part be pro-social enterprise / mutual, social value principles reinforced.

2014

• Social Investment Tax Relief - 30% personal tax relief for investors in CICs and charities up to £5m

2014

• Social Value Act review iby UK Government, Procurement Reform Act enacted in Scotland






